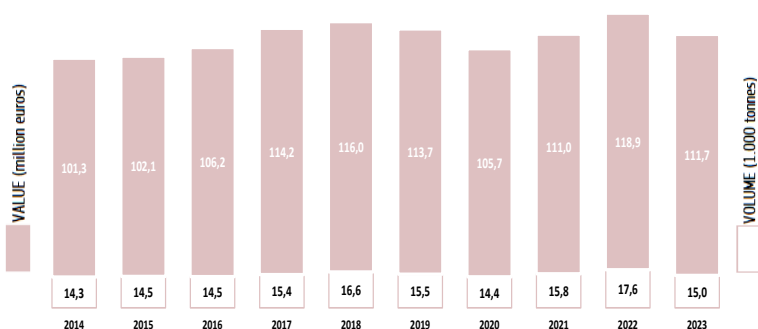

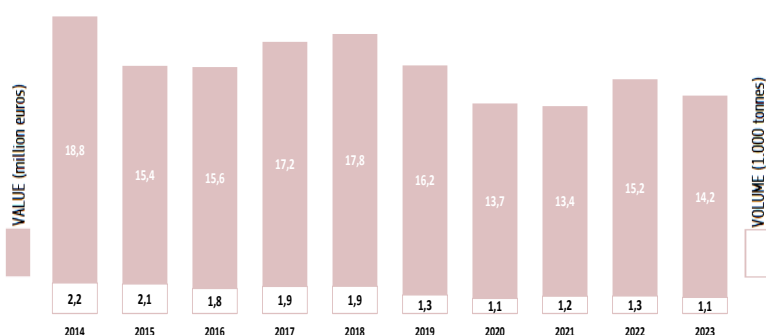

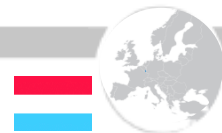

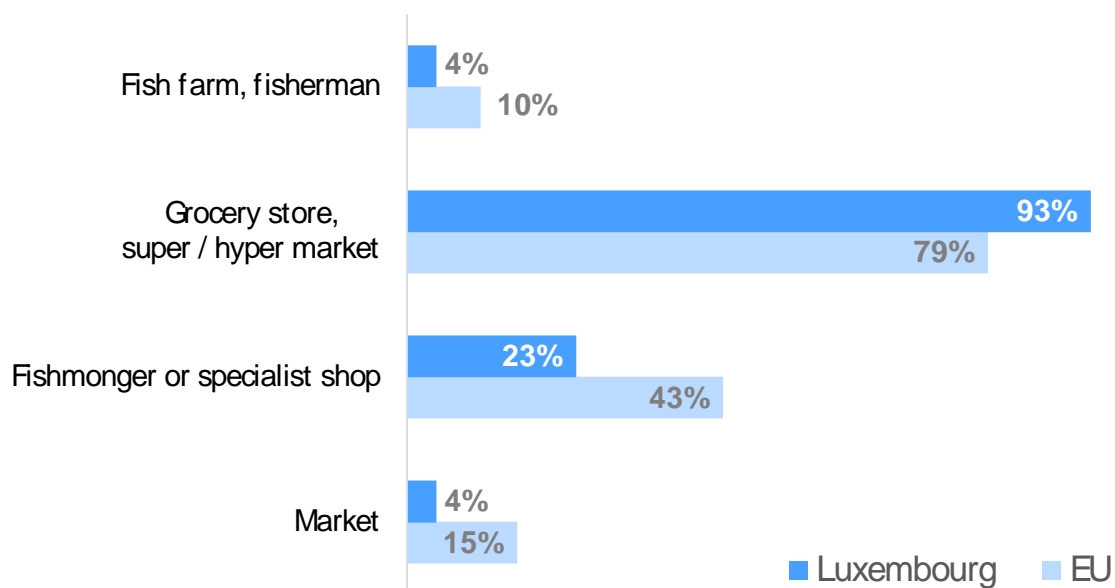

Consumer preferences on purchasing channels (source: Eurobarometer, 2021):





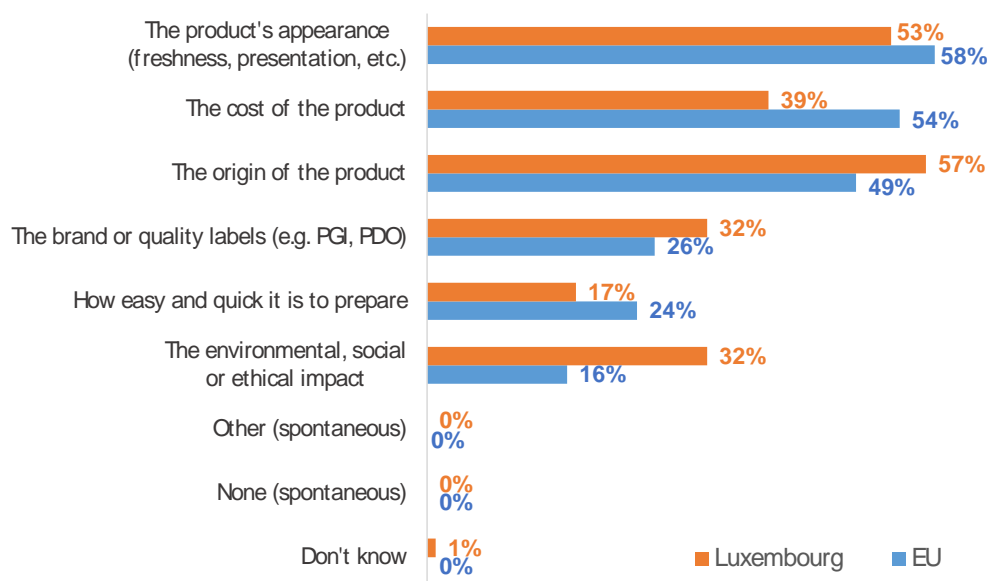
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CONSUMPTION

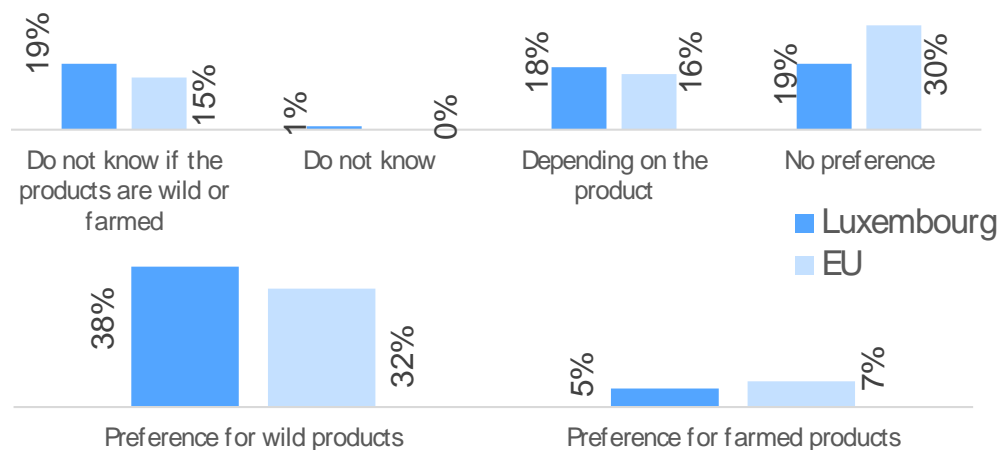
In 2022, apparent consumption was estimated at 30,43 kg per capita, a 3%-decrease compared with 2021. The most consumed species were salmon and cod (source: EUMOFA). The country is characterized by a high percentage of regular fish consumers, namely those who eat fishery and aquaculture products at least once a month (77% on average in the country, compared with 72% on average at EU-28 level). In each age group, this percentage is higher than the EU average (UK included). Preferences of consumers in Luxembourg are for fresh products (source: EUMOFA, "EU consumer habits regarding fishery and aquaculture products", 2017).
